District 28 Past Presidents Parley
Standing Rules

1. Past District Presidents in this District shall meet on the 1st Sunday of April and the 1st Sunday of October at 1:30 PM.
2. Eligibility: Any Past President of this District and/or Unit who has completed at least half of their year and is a member in good standing with a current ALA card is entitled to all privileges within the Parley. Past District Presidents **and Past Unit Presidents** from other Districts are welcome to participate in all PDP functions as a guest if they are members in good standing.
3. Annual Donation shall be \$5.00 and payable at the October meeting.
4. A quorum shall be **two (2) Past District Presidents and one (1) Past Unit President**.
5. There shall be a drawing at each meeting, tickets to be 7 for \$5.00. Proceeds go to the care of ex-servicewomen or Department Nurses Scholarship. Winner to supply the next gift (value \$20.00).
6. Donations to the care of ex-servicewomen and nurses' scholarship are to be made at the April meeting. Amount to be sent to the District Treasurer to transmit to Department in the name of the District PDP. District Treasurer shall transmit to Department PPP all but \$20.00 of the District PPP funds and D28 Scholarship funds.
7. A Past District President shall be elected President of the Parley at the April meeting for a two-year term.
8. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected at the April meeting for a two-year term. He/She shall be responsible for sending notices three (3) weeks in advance of the meeting and payment of any funds, when approved by the majority present.
9. The Secretary-Treasurer shall send a copy of the minutes to the President of PDP prior to the meeting.
10. The current District President shall be invited to the April meeting.



11. PDP Parley briefcase (minutes, etc.) to be given to the newly elected PDP Secretary-Treasurer on or before the last District meeting.
12. All monies generated for the District 28 PDP Scholarship shall be awarded to a local student in the nursing program at a local community college.
