She wanted to let Auxiliary know, to pass the word out to the members and your local communities, about Neighborhood Watch Program and City Crime Prevention. This information can be received by going into the internet and by getting involved with your community.

Last of all, please, check on your neighbors and give them assistance if need.

Shore Patrol Chairmen, since locally, we are now in the rainy season and because we been through bad a fire season, we need to be aware of mud slides, falling trees, power lines, lighting strikes and etc...

The most important things, to think about, are having an Emergency Plan <u>listening to the news,</u>

Always, carry an Emergency Kit for home and car and have on hand water, medication for you and your pets. Store extra food inside the home and outside in a container for example: garbage can with: can goods, rice, noodles, coffee, coffee pot, sauce pans, utensils, lighter/matches, sleeping bag, tent and etc...
