Department National Security, Roseann Vicky Bean received an **ALERT** message from the Western Division Chairman, Darlene Allen. She wanted to let Auxiliary know, to pass the word out to the members and your local communities, about **Neighborhood Watch Program** and **City Crime Prevention**. This information can be received by going into the internet and by getting involved with your community.

Last of all, please, check on your neighbors and give them assistance if need.

Shore Patrol Chairmen, since locally, we are now in the rainy season and because we been through bad a fire season, we need to be aware of mud slides, falling trees, power lines, lighting strikes and etc...

The most important things, to think about, are having an **Emergency Plan** listening to the news, for evacuation orders and weather reports. Check out, you're local City Hall to see if they have a Fallout Shelter.

At the end of October, the news is warning about an earthquake. We haven't had one a big one in awhile. You never know when any disaster will hit, it maybe man-made or natural.

Always, carry an **Emergency Kit** for home and car and have on hand water, medication for you and your pets. Store extra food inside the home and outside in a container for example: garbage can with: can goods, rice, noodles, coffee, coffee pot, sauce pans, utensils, lighter/matches, sleeping bag, tent and etc...

Here is information, I've typed out and it's called, **EMERGENCY & INTERVENTION AGENCIES.**  
This is a way the ALA Shore Patrol can protect, the families, single people, communities and yourselves.
